1. Youth Matter's Co-Chair

2. Brief Introductions of Committee Members

3. Challenge Day – Update...

• Dates Confirmed:

Discussion:

Each day, two schools are allowed to be present in Challenge Day. It was suggested that the **Ed Centre and FV Distance Ed** and be given some spaces for their students in one of the days.

- Committee has agreed that the Ed Centre (piggy back with GWG) and Fraser Valley Distance Ed Students (piggy back with CSS) be invited to a Challenge Event.
- Committee has agreed that the Challenge Day events for this year be for High School Students (gr: 10-12) and next year will focus more for Middle School (Gr: 7-9).
- Kathryn will connect with the New Youth Worker at the Distance Ed Centre to let her know

<u>ACTION:</u> Kathryn will connect with the New Youth Worker at Distance Ed to let her know about Challenge Day and to invite her to attend the Youth Matter's Committee.

Contracts have been received.

- Schools have signed off on the contracts.
- Youth Matter's has signed off on the contract.
- Will be forwarded back to Challenge Day by end of April.

Invoice has been received

- Cost is less than originally anticipated. (\$9,600.00 US)
- 1st payment/installment required Aug. 21st (\$3,600.00 US)
- 2nd payment/installment required Sept. 20th (\$3,000.00 US) 3rd payment/installment required Oct. 20th (\$3,000.00 US)

- Recommend that Challenge Day fly into Bellingham and get a rental car more cost effective.
- Or fly into Abbotsford Kelli Paddon has a connection with a car rental company and can get us a deal (likely)

- Carol reviewed the Challenge Day Budget from 2011 from SSS.

Venue

CSS Neighbourhood Learning Centre/ Training Hall can be used. (Brian checked it out and it may work). Logistics still need to be worked out and implemented (ie: booking the hall). If the neighbourhood learning centre does not work – the new school has 2 gymnasiums and one of the gymnasiums could be booked for the 3 days for Challenge Day.

- School Rep's met with Susan Edgecombe.
 - Susan did commit to \$5000.00 from the School District.
 - Did not talk specifically talk about bussing.
 - They did discuss about meeting with the PAC's from each school as well. They will need to be presented in September at the PAC meetings.

ACTION: Carol will follow up with Susan to confirm if the \$5000.00 is for the committee to use wherever needed, or if it's assigned to anything specific (ie: bussing, TOC Coverage).

Presenting at School Board Meeting

Not good to put the board on the spot to approve money (requesting money at a board meeting is not what the meetings are about). Brian met with a board member (Evelyn Novak) - if we present, it would be best to present Challenge Day to the board as an informational meeting (so they are aware of what it is). Brian asked about getting it on the agenda...Evelyn would take it to a board planning meeting and request Youth Matter's can get on a May agenda.

ACTION: Brian will follow up with Evelyn to see how the planning meeting went and if the Youth Matter's Committee did in fact gat on the Agenda for the May School Board Meeting.

Inviting Students to help with Fundraising for Challenge Day

- Possibly Leadership Students?
- Duties for Students could include: Hanging up posters, making announcements over PA systems, preparing snacks, etc.
- Youth Matter's Committee could present at the CSS Leadership sleepover in June about Challenge Day – to get the buzz going.
- 2 reps from each of the schools would be ideal.
- Discussion around which Students to invite to sit on the committee...

There was a brief discussion on how the schools will determine which 100 students from the various schools will be selected to participate in Challenge Day. Committee will need to discuss this further and focus on the process of who to invite to Challenge Day and how we will do it.
