

Child and Youth Committee Mission Statement

The Chilliwack CYC represents a variety of community groups, governmental and nongovernmental. We provide leadership and advocacy in the delivery of human/social services to children, youth and their families. Our mission is to work collaboratively, in liaison with clients/consumers, in the design, implementation and evaluation of the continuum of services which enhance the well-being of children, youth and their families.





Chilliwack Child and Youth Committee Principles

- 1. The needs of children and youth are generally best met within their family/community;
- 2. We believe in a continuum of family/community based services;
- 3. We affirm the value of the family and recognize that our community influences contributes to the character and development of our children, youth and families;
- 4. We believe in community cooperation in planning, decision making and allocation of resources;
- 5. We are here to benefit the community, and therefore we believe in the promotion of wellness, with an emphasis on prevention;
- 6. The quality of the process of decision making (includes participation by those affected, empowerment, relationship building, open and honest communication, and respect for the consumer) strongly influences the outcome;
- 7. Every person has worth and deserves to be treated with dignity;
- 8. We believe that honouring individual and group diversity promotes respect and dignity;
- 9. We believe that children, youth and their families are a high priority for resource allocation.

Nomination for Membership

- 1. Be a provider of services or resources to children, youth and families.
- 2. Agencies that have a breadth of focus including children from birth to age 18 years.
- 3. Individuals must be designated to represent and speak for their organization.
- 4. Ex-officio members with exceptional interest may be accepted as deemed appropriate for the group.


Rationale: This structure allows for participation of large numbers of individuals and groups while insuring that decision making regarding new funding and programming is by those who are mandated and broadly representative.

Terms of Reference

- 1. CYC meetings will take place on the first Tuesday morning of each month: 9:00am 11:00am, September through June.
- 2. Each member will be committed to attending monthly meetings.
- 3. Each member will cover absences with an alternate who will be available and briefed about current CYC business.
- 4. Each member will be committed to active participation in the work of CYC through one or more of the following: task group/ad hoc committees, subcommittee in CYC.
- 5. Each member to inform and discuss CYC issues within their organization.
- 6. Membership in each CYC subcommittee is related to the purpose of that subcommittee.



Annual Strategic Planning Cycle






Structure of the Child and Youth Committee and it's Sub-Committees

The design of Chilliwack CYC encompasses a broad range of involvement in CYC operations. Sub committees allow a means for the expertise of individuals, (consumers and single programs) as well as mandated program staff to serve the interest of the broader group.

Sub committees are linked to the CYC through liaison members from the main committee. Each sub committee has at least one member from the main CYC. Youth participation will be supported.

The CYC assigns a formal representative to community committees for information sharing and networking.
