 which did not have any parent attendees but was still a good opportunity to connect and discuss support to
 families.
- Thank you to Carol for coordinating logistics and contracts with the curling club, the City really stepped up to support the Conversation and covered some of the set-up costs.
- Both of the in-person social events were unique for the CYC. There was great attendance and participation.



- Shout out to the CSS R & B and Jazz bands, Leary Integrated Arts and Technology School Choir, and Sardis Drumline. Really impressed by the talent of the District's students.
- There were 12 agencies that contributed financially towards the Conversation that was a \$17000 venture.
 Most of the money went to honorariums for speakers.
- The 2 keynotes were inspiring, and it was such an honor to have them both speak at our event Aaron Pete keynote on Tuesday and Steven Point Keynote on Friday. Both were wonderful and we are grateful for their time.

5. Program Presentation: Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA)

20 minutes

- Bungee and Hawk
 - Showed a you tube video to introduce the work of BACA

 - Hawk read out the mission statement of BACA <u>https://bacaworld.org/mission/</u>
 - How did bikers get involved in child abuse?
 - Started in 1995 in the US, by a founder who was a social worker and play therapist.
 - Founder identified that there was a gap in the help and empowerment of children who experienced child abuse.
 - Use brotherhood of bikers to give children empowerment and take away the fear they are living, and gain strength.
 - Organization has grown, in 18 different countries around the world, 48 US states. In Canada, the first chapter started was in Saskatoon in 2012. BACA started in BC, in 2014, Hawk one of the founding members in BC; there are 6 chapters around BC. Hawk has been a part of BACA since it started in BC, 8 years ago. Hawk is Chapter President. Fraser Valley chapter is strong, about 30 members.
 - Lots of training involved to be a volunteer, including orientation, webinars, Criminal Record Check



- o Hold monthly meetings, both open and closed meeting, invite public.
- Levels of intervention, support available to children 24/7, not therapists but support as a friend as a source of support to reach out to.
- Support for kids during the court process. Can be very scary for kids. Spend the day with the child.
- Helpline, international and within chapters. Parent/Guardian requests involvement. Speak to Angel, Child Liaison.
- Do not get involved in cases of Domestic Violence or Bullying, has to have been reported to proper authorities. Have an intake process.
- Do an initial intake at the home of the child. It is up to the child if they want BACA involved. Kids pick road name.
- So happy to be a part of the Chilliwack CYC. Already a member of the Abbotsford CYC. Bungee is Agency Liaison and PR for the chapter. Want BACA to be viewed as a tool for agencies.
 Expressed gratitude for being invited to join the Chilliwack CYC.
- Answered questions about program and approach. Challenges in supporting children when parents are not supportive or if the abuse is happening in the home. Also, how to ensure focus is not on creating dependency but rather empowering. How does BACA approach situations that involve children who have diverse gender identities? BACA does not discriminate.

- The April 14th meeting was with the Early Years Committee and Early Years Leaders. 5 times this year Strategic Leader Meetings are scheduled, which are times when ED's and other leaders are invited to join.
