4. Program Presentation: FamilySmart, Parent in Resident Program

- Corinna Landsberger
- PowerPoint slides included with the minutes.
- Support families who have children and youth (0 to 24+ years of age) with substance and/or mental health challenges. They come alongside parents, they understand the experiences of the parent as they have similar experiences in their lives. They do not turn people away who have adult children who are struggling.
- 10,410 young people, families and service providers connected with our Peer Support Workers significant increases in connection and engagement.
- Services Offered: Emotional support (meet them for coffee, go for walks, connect over the phone/online); Information & resources (on their website); help in understanding and navigating services (know their community well and keep themselves informed on resources); attend meetings with families & caregivers (can help prepare for the meeting, can attend the meeting to take notes & being a supportive person).
- Confidential free service and they don't have waitlists no diagnosis is needed.
- Services can last as long and/or as short as the family needs. Referrals can be from the family or service provider.

- Monthly Events: 'In the Know' every month, we host events where we watch a video and share experiences and strategies that help in hard moments and focus on strengthening our understanding & connection with our kids. Events are facilitated by FamilySmart Parent Peer Support Workers.

- Primary Prevention Levi Bailey, Chilliwack Youth Health Center (CYHC), UFV BSW Practicum Student
 - Senator tweeted out the survey they created; they now have 64 surveys completed.
 - In contact with the Ministry of Education, with the Curriculum Coordinator and are reviewing their sexual health education. Porn is not being discussed or shared in our curriculum.
 - This is Levi's last CYC meeting as he is completing his practicum with CYHC. Over the summer this project will be put on hold and will likely be picked up by another intern from the CYHC in September.
- Early Years Annette Williams, Chilliwack Learning Society (CLS)
 - Truth & Reconciliation learning continued with a presentation of the local tradition territories.
 - The meeting's TRC Calls to Action topic was Language & Culture.
 - Pillar two of the Strategic Action Plan was discussed Supportive Responsive Relationships and local programming options were shared as they fit within that action.
 - Government Early Learning and Child Care engagement sessions were reviewed.
 - Chilliwack School District's Ready Set Learn and Kinderfair dates have been set. Organizations have volunteered to be present to make connections with parents.
 - CYC Conversation details were discussed and there are 5 great EY presenters at the CYC
 Conversation this year.

- Last EDRD training was on March 9th. They had 11 participants: MCFD, CLBC, MLA Office, Ann Davis, and a few other agencies.
- Event went really well were able to take the recommendations from the last in person event and incorporate them and didn't end up having any recommendations for how we could do it better.
- There were some suggestions around ways to put in physical barriers that make it harder to get to the various agencies. There were also suggestions around putting a required wait time at different agencies to add to the simulation experience.
- Overall, general comments spoke to how help it was, how much they learned, how meaningful it was.



 The goal is to provide the EDRD Fall session in person. CYHC has a large box with information on the previous year's facilitations, which allows for the interns to make changes and recommendations to the training as they see fit.

Gambling Supports BC, Donna Simon

- The program is a provincial program, under the Community Supports Division of the Ministry of the Attorney General.
- Donna is a prevention worker, she engages with the community to provide awareness and education of gambling, gaming, and online gambling. Focus is on balancing activities. Donna covers Langley to Boothroyd – supporting ages 5 to 99+, for Indigenous and non-indigenous individuals. She tailors her work to be age appropriate.
