Started with the high schools and middle schools has begun. Working in partnership with MCFD and FVACFSS. Graduation Rates for CYIC across BC as of 2019/2020 56.2%.

Angela Rieberger, CCECSS- Most programs on hold due to covid, waiting to see how school opening goes. Only program running at this time is the pre-school.

We're collaborating with the Chilliwack Library in a StoryWalk inside the library from January 17-31. Kelly Guiaya- UFV School of Social Work and Human Services – UFV Winter 2022 semester delayed one week, began on January 10th. Students started their practicum placements the week of January 5. Gratitude expressed for the host agencies who facilitated placements this past Fall 2021 and for the agencies and schools hosting students for this Winter 2022 semester. Great to see so many practicum students getting involved with CYC through their agencies.

Levi Bailey, - Chilliwack Youth Health Centre, UFV BSW Practicum Student, no other update.

Maddy Britz, Big Brothers Big Sisters - Last week with BBBS but staying involved with CYC as a practicum student with CYHC. Building social emotional resilience program. Have new groups continuing and more opening at schools.

Nikki Dionne, CCS, Youth Services - Moving into a Director role at CCS at the end of this month. Congrats Nikki! There will be a new Youth Services Coordinator. Youth Recreation Program - Free afterschool programing for youth ages 9-19.

New recreation worker has joined the team. Support programs all still running. Xmas dinner update- it was amazing. Hosted 2 hours for juniors and 2 hours for seniors, over 90 youth attended, still had a blast even though it was outside in the rain. Still getting feedback from youth and caregivers. Looking forward to planning the next one. Really good turn out and a good time had by all.

Steve Esau, PCRS Traverse- Outreach and Counsellors up and running, out in the community and in the office, Traverse has a couple of vacant beds.

Steve Roukema, Restorative Justice- In the process of starting strategic planning over the next few months, expecting growing pains. Want to raise more awareness in the community and in the schools about the work of Restorative Justice as the agency can do more if people know about it. One of the main focuses right now is to create more awareness in Chilliwack and beyond.

Sunita Lakhanpal, Sardis Library- Mother Goose program January 12-March 2, FVCDC partnership, 9:30am-10am; 11am-11:30am. Everything else is still online.

Trevor Wiens, Cyrus Centre - Drop in and shelter still operating, 12:30pm-8pm, serve lunch and dinner, provide a safe space for vulnerable youth. Shelter every night for youth ages 13-19, and a separate space for youth older youth ages 19-23. Additional beds still open due to weather and covid. Providing space for people who are homeless and/or covid symptomatic. Switchback has been in operation for over one year. There are currently 18-19 youth and young adults living there, ages 16-24 and 3 children living there also. Designed for youth who have a history of homelessness but not able to live on their own. 24 hours, 2 staff model, different relationships some have with substances, open and honest conversations. Just got a new puppy for the building. Stay tuned how that goes!

Tara Cummings- YMCA - Closed due to the public health orders, as a fitness facility, still offering programming online. Youth Beat Fraser Valley employment program, new cohort, starting on February 7th. YMCA Youth BEAT Fraser Valley employment program starting new cohort Feb 7th youth ages 17-29 more info at youthbeatfraservalley@eventbrite.ca Wanda Smith, MCFD - New Executive Director of Service, named Walter (last name?). Practicum students starting up again in the office, also with CYMH. MCFD is excited about having students again. Covid restrictions haven't impacted much as MCFD provides essential service. Have safety precautions in place and doing the work that needs to be done.
