4. Program Presentation: Chilliwack Society for Community Living (CSCL)

• Dan Bibby and Aileen Mathews

- Dan and Aileen introduced themselves. Dan has been with CSCL for 5 months as a director; Aileen is a manager for the children and youth programs and has been with CSCL for 7 years, just returning from maternity leave. Dan and Aileen shared a PowerPoint presentation and a video narrated by ED Julie Unger. - o Largest Non-Profit in Chilliwack, over 300 employees and 20 sites around Chilliwack
- Over 30 % of their programming is for children and youth
- Also provide services and programming in the Fraser Cascade
- After school programs- referral based programs from MCFD
- Host summer camps
- o After school programs- referral based programs from MCFD
- o Respite programs- referral based programs from MCFD
- There is also access to hotel stays from various hotels in the community for families who may need a break
- o Also have Autism specific services- directly linked to funding.
- Shared a video about *social capital*, where everyone is included in their community and neighborhood.
- Wanda Smith from MCFD shared changes happening with MCFD CYSN with regards to moving into a hub model. Interior and Northwest SDAs are starting with early implementation, currently in the process of proposal requests for the hubs. Autism funding is changing also. Each client will have one key person, a coordinator/navigator. New program will be fully implemented by 2025. Phone # to call with questions about these changes is 1-833-882-0024. - Primary Prevention Jennifer Hawkins, Fraser Health- no report available.
- Early Years Annette Williams, Chilliwack Learning Society

At the opening of the October Early Years meeting 5 of the Truth & Reconciliation Calls to Action were read and discussed. This process will continue over the next several meetings. The Service Coordinator from Jordan's Principle presented about the program and her role. The Strategic Plan work has progressed well. There was a short presentation on the EDI data and vulnerabilities. Agency updates around the table occurred, as they do at every meeting. The updated Family Resource Guide will soon be complete and circulated.



• Middle Years – Aileen Mathews, CSCL

Identified what they want to work on for the next little bit. Reviewed survey results and MDI, developing a resource guide for middle years age is something they will be working on, looking at some resources and parent networking initiatives. Hosting a practicum student who will help with all of this. Strategic plan in the works. Dan added, practicum student from UFV to be assisting with the middle years resource directory.

• Youth Matters – Tara Cummings, YMCA & Haley Hodgkinson, CCS

Things are happening. The youth advisory has some great projects planned for this year and even have some funding for a multiculturalism/anti-racism event, being planned for the spring. Another project of the youth advisory is one on homelessness prevention, happening in December. It will likely be a newsworthy piece. There has been discussion about BC Youth Week, something the committee looked at being involved in pre-covid, want to get youth advisory committee on board with this. The next Youth Matters meeting is November 17th, 9:30-10:30.

7. CYC Collaborative Partners Updates:

School District #33- Brenda Calendino- Jessica Adams-Lupret, District Vice Principal for student services, students with disabilities and diverse abilities. The PowerPoint is attached to the minutes. Journey towards inclusion as opposed to integration in the school districts and ministry of education. Still using old language. Inclusive Ed Manual in draft. Not yet seen funding shift but seen draft of funding manual. Categories A-G supports. New funding is hoped to be more needs based as opposed to category based. Want classrooms to be a student's home base. Outlined supports available in schools and what is available at the district level. Community supports also identified in addition to Provincial partnerships. Strengths and stretches. Trauma informed lens being implemented in the district. A lot of training has gone on in the district around this. There is a gap to supports for parents. Long waitlists anywhere from 1-3 years. Not getting kids categorized quickly enough. Any questions?
