6. Program Presentation: Youth Unlimited, the TRUCK

20 minutes

- Ken Neufeld
 - Project history: Youth Unlimited had an existing youth centre that was 'brick and mortar' but it had barriers to running one centre that ended up being the main reason of wanting to have a mobile youth centre.
 - Mobile Youth Centre goes right into the neighbourhood kids tend to be younger who engaged with the program.

 They are able to connect with youth at an early stage and get them access to resources early on get to walk alongside the youth early on. By having the relationship established early they are able to utilize that relationship of trust to support the youth when they are in crisis.
 - Original Double Decker bus was on the road for 12 years eventually had to take it off the road because of mechanical issues.
 - Started dreaming of having another one and what they'd need to make this work. The idea came to them that they could use a firetruck as the base for the mobile centre.
 - Started looking for a specific fire truck, and found one in Atlanta, Georgia. Bought it for \$19,000. A local manufacturer was able to help them take the firetruck and build out the empty shell. They now have a two-story youth centre –

 - The bus is parked in the Bernard neighbourhood once a week. There is a specific team there every week, of trained individuals 7-10 adults (2 upstairs, 2 downtowns, 2 outside, 1 floater). The TRUCK is like the 'front door' of Every Door is the Right Door approach. Operating 2 days a week in Abbotsford and 1 day a week in Chilliwack wanting to expand, but not at this time. Will stay in the Bernard neighbourhood for the foreseeable future, want to maintain long term relationships with this neighbourhood.
 - Before they park in the neighbourhood, they go door to door to connect with folks and share with them about the centre to be welcomed into the space.
 - Considering 'pop-up' opportunities, where they can drop in and their Truck can be a resource at an event.
 - Considering a summer drop-in with Kw'iyeqel Secondary School to provide supports over the summer
