- Restorative Justice Overview:
- Alternative to justice system involvement through a Restorative Justice Circle. Within a month, the goal is to have a Restorative Justice Circle set up.



- Restorative Response: Restorative Circle → Resolution Agreement (Police are often involved in this process with a police file)
- School Response: Restorative Circle → Resolution Agreement
- From a Resolution Agreement, a Mentor Support is involved. This individual helps with ensuring the individual fulfills their Resolution Agreement.
- <u>Mentoring Response:</u> Want to make a 2<sup>nd</sup> part of the Resolution Agreement, where there is a long term mentor connection made. This mentor relationship would be voluntary that would be 3-12 months long.
  - At 3 months you evaluate how things are going for the individual and determine if the mentor relationship should be longer than 3 months.
  - Focused on developing goals, accessing community resources and services, supporting mentee in establishing healthy relationships and participating in prosocial activities.
  - For individuals who are connected to the criminal justice system, not just anyone can access a mentor in this program

#### Pilot Project:

- Running from January 2023 to November 2023 with 10 mentees, with the goal of establishing strong data to support their funding from Civil Forfeiture Grant – goal of getting \$75K and launch program for 20 mentees by May 2024.
- Working with a research team at UFV to support an evaluation process

- Alexa Hendricks, CCS: Meeting with ELL teachers in the District and connecting with families. Presenting
  at the November CYC meeting.
- Annette Williams, Chilliwack Learning Society:
  - This past summer our StoryWalk materials was borrowed by Child Care Resource & Referral, for popup StoryWalks in various parks each Friday morning for 2 hours. We partnered with Chilliwack Central Elementary School for two StoryWalk events, one in each month. Book materials were provided and Bookworm Friends volunteers read the books in story times and did crafts with the kids.
  - We have been facilitating workshops for the Better Beginnings program to help the prenatal and postnatal (up to 6 months aged child) moms to understand how to manage their money better and make it stretch further. These workshops are on a break until the new year.
  - The English as a Second Language Coordinator posting has closed and interviews are occurring this week.
  - The Vancouver Sun/Province ran an article about Raise a Reader funded projects, which included an interview segment from CLS about the impact of the funds.

- Candace, BBBS: Starting our school based program for the 22/23 school year. Focused on resuming the matches that I had from previous years, got most schools resumed, still waiting on some. then October and November is focused on making all of my new matches. I hope to have 20 new matches and am making new partnerships with high schools to make even more matches, one new high school I'm meeting with is at Mount Cheam Christian School! I'm excited for that partnership. I hope to get the program out in Hope as well at the high school for teen mentors and get them matched at Hope elementary schools.



- Corinna Landsberger, Family Smart: Recording of Building Connection with our Kids when it feels
  impossible, a conversation of two participants. A recording of Adel La France. In December on ADHD
  with Dr Duncan. Seeing 50-100 participants to each workshop. Has capacity to serve more families, just
  reach out directly. Open house for professionals for our Help for the Hard Times

- **Cristal Biela, FH:** Working on implementation of the ACES Strategies. Creating a 1-2-page document that can be shared with the community, as well as a toolkit.
- Dan Bibby, CSCL: Sensory Room booked out by families and individuals who can use the room. A safe space that has a number of sensory items for children and youth to engage with. CSCL just did a large update on the room and it will be available to be booked. Very affordable, approx. \$5/hour for renting the room.
- Danielle Otermat, Restorative Justice: Has met with all the admins of the target schools, getting a lot of good feedback from the schools about the program. Added grade 7 to their target grades, originally was just for grade 4, 6 & 8 but they had remaining resources so added grade 7. Starting classroom-based program by October 17<sup>th</sup>. Brought on two new staff to help with this program. Started Restorative Circles in the schools again, no files yet but they are available.
- Jae Yoo, CHYM: Very busy, some groups are going on right now. Intake system has changed, as of this Wednesday 9-11am and 1-3pm there is walk-in intake at the MCFD office on School St access from the back entrance in the parking lot.
- Jannette Loosdrecht, Afternoon Adventures: Launching their programs today, 8 out of 9 programs are starting today. 147 international students in the School District and the School District has asked for some students to have an opportunity to volunteer in the AA programs. Working on finding a partner church for AD Rundle to run the Hangout Program.
- Kaleigh Roberts, CCS Youth Services: Launched the lifeskills program, called Get Stuff Done. Reconnect
  Program is doing a program partnership with Sardis Doorway and MCFD under When Loves Hurts,
  adapted for youth. Youth Recreation caught their breath in September and is kicking off the full program
  in October.
- **Kate Healey, CCS:** CCS is working on finalizing their Strategic Plan, with the goal of it being ready and released by late Fall. Youth Services Christmas Party planning is underway and we are partnering with the Communities Building Youths Futures(CBYF) Program for this year's event. The CBYF Program is



hosting videos and interviews on engaging youth to vote in the upcoming Municipal election, check out our social media for more information.

- **Kelly Guiaya, UFV:** UFV open house on October 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Abbotsford Campus, you can take a tour and get to know some more programs. Karen Derksen has been hired as the new Practicum and Internship Coordinator of Human Services. - Tammy Webb, Ann Davis Society: PEACE Program starts next week. Hired a new Children's Counselor. Purple Lights Night is now underway tree lighting at the RCMP office last night. Bringing awareness of intimate partner violence.
- Tara Cummings, YMCA: Name change at the Chilliwack YMCA, it's now the Bob Chan-Kent Family YMCA

   there will be an official press release shortly. Halloween is the deadline for the next round of the Youth
   BEAT Employment Program, connect with Tara. At this time, they have 3 groups left in their contract as they aren't sure if they'll get funding extensions. YMCA has a lot of employment opportunities right now.
- Trevor Wiens, Cyrus Centre: Outreach Cyrus Centre received funds through Reaching Home to increase and provide a more robust approach to youth street outreach in Chilliwack. With increased staffing and strategic partnerships (PCRS, CCS, CYHC, Mémiyelhtel), street outreach for youth aged 12-24 will be taking place in Chilliwack Monday to Friday. This outreach will take place until March 31, 2022 when funding concludes but we are hoping to have established mechanisms in place and secure further funding for it to continue. Coming Home Gala On November 4, 2022 Cyrus Centre is once again hosting its annual fundraiser gala.
